## **Owning a firearm in Canada**

Guns are legal in Canada but are controlled by <u>strict gun laws</u>, particularly the Canadian <u>Criminal Code</u> and the <u>Firearms Act</u> (1995) plus <u>related regulations</u>.

'First-time' Canadians over 18 years of age must pass the <u>Canadian Firearms</u> <u>Safety Course</u> before applying for a '<u>Possession and Acquisitions</u>' (PAL) licence. There are two types of PAL's – one for non-restricted firearms and the other for restricted. Licences must be renewed every five years. The Safety Course involves in-class instruction plus a written and practical test. Restricted or prohibited firearms must be registered.

Firearms in Canada fall into three different classes:

- <u>Non-restricted</u>: any rifle/shotgun that is not restricted or prohibited
- <u>Restricted</u>: handguns that are not prohibited; a barrel less than 470mm in length; a semi-automatic, plus other conditions
- <u>Prohibited</u>: hand guns with barrels less than 105mm in length, plus other conditions

There are also very specific 'permitted purposes' for acquiring or possessing a restricted firearm:

- Target practice or target shooting competitions
- As part of a collection
- In connection with one's lawful profession/occupation or to protect life
